

THE LITTLE GRAY SCHOOLHOUSE

A major and moving achievement in 1977 was the relocation and restoration of Schoolhouse No. 1 District 1. The school now located near the Tante Blanche Museum is a remarkable feat of local ingenuity and it proudly served as the meeting house for the 1978 Board. Progress was delayed by errant pine boards but with the donation of substantial land by Ernest Chasse the Old School now reposes in quiet dignity to serve its unique historical position for many years to come.



The Malawaska Historical Society is proud to report to the citizens of Malawaska that two most significant achievements were made during the past year. Land for a roadway was purchased from U. S. #1 to the famed Acadian Cross as well as land surrounding the Cross. Construction of the roadway will be started in the spring. This purchase was made possible by a matching grant from the Maine Historic Preservation Commission.

With these two projects Malawaska can now boast of a historic center. Much more remains to be done and will be done since your Society is dedicated to the task of fostering and preserving our own rich cultural and historical values.

In August we sponsored a successful, week long Opera workshop at the University of Maine at Fort Kent with grants from Maine Arts and Humanities and Boston University Bilingual Resource and Training Center.

In the meantime, the operation of the Tante Blanche museum was maintained from mid-June through mid-September. Visitor statistics remained at a steady level.

Donations of artifacts, valuable books and papers continued throughout the year. The sale of publications likewise continued at a steady rate throughout the year.

The Society deeply appreciates the sincere interest and support by the citizens of Malawaska. No progress could be made without it.




