Meetings:

1. Board of Directors:

- a. Directors meeting was called by Mr. Roger Paradis on the 6th of April, 1971, to explore the possibility of developing an Acadian village and yearly festivals in the St. John Valley. Northern Maine Regional Development officials were present to furnish information on the possibilities of funding. Funding of the projects involved appears remote.
- b. A directors meeting was called by the President, Mr. A.J. Michaud, on the 4th of November, 1971, to discuss the plans and activities for the forthcoming year. An additional category for annual dues of \$2.00 was also approved.

- a. A combined meeting of directors, officers and committee chairmen was called on the 14th of July 1971, to discuss and to reappraise the financial status of the Society as a result of the moving of the log cabin, since the bills exceeded the assets. It was unanimously voted to obtain a note from the Aroostook Trust Company for \$3,000.00. The sum of \$1,500.00 only was actually borrowed, although the Society could borrow more on an "if-needed" basis.
- b. A gala and spectacular meeting was held at the Wandlyn Motel in Edmundston, New Brunswick, on the 7th of August, 1971, in honor of Dr. Otto Luening, professor emeritus, of Columbia University. Dr. Luening explained his efforts and hard work in his composition of the opera "Evangeline" and presented the score of it to the Society. Tape recordings of the opera were also made available to the Society. Dr. and Mrs. Luening charmed everyone. Their kindness is deeply appreciated.

3. General:

a. The winter meeting was held on the 17th of February, 1971, at the Public Library. The guest speaker was one of the foremost authorities on the Acadian ancestries of Valley residents, Monsignor Ernest Long of Saint Basile, New Brunswick. Msgr. Long is publishing the geneologies by alphabetical volumes and presented the first volume to the Society. All the volumes will be acquired by the Society as they are published.

- b. The Spring meeting was held on the 4th of May, 1971, at the Public Library. The guest speaker was Mr. Austin Wylie, who spoke on the Hill of Fame of Valley residents, in particular, Peter Charles Keegan, for whom the town of Keegan was named. Mr. Wylie also spoke on the early town meetings of Van Buren and Grand Isle from old records he researched in those areas. Mrs. Blanche Savoy was also given the most valuable member award for 1971.
 - c. The Fall meeting was held on the 10th of October, 1971, at the Public Library. The members all enjoyed a delightful home movie of the 1969 Madawaska Centennial Pageant and related events. The film was loaned to the Society by Mr. David Cyr of Glendale, California, formerly of St. David. A duplicate of the film is to be made for the Society.

NOTES OF INTEREST

The small museum the Society has established in St. David created interest beyond our initial expectations. Despite our limited capability, it was visited by over 1,500 people during the day of the St. David Parish Centennial on the 18th of July and by over 1,000 people during the following three weeks of operation. Much credit is due to the help rendered by the Rural Youth Corps workers assigned to the Society during the summer months.

A monumental rock, weighing approximately twenty tons, was also placed on the museum grounds through the efforts of Mr. Lucien Cyr of Madawaska. A bronze plaque, which was placed on the old Acadion Cross in 1939 in honor of the Acadians, was affixed to the rock. Another plaque, commemorating the St. David Centennial and donated to the Society by the St. David Centennial Committee, was also affixed to the rock underneath the first plaque. Both plaques were affixed by Roland and Charles Daigle of Madawaska, who donated their time and equipment.

It should be noted that the labor involved in the moving of bothe the cabin and rock was made by volunteer crews from St. David and Madawaska. The heavy equipment required was also donated. All the particular parties involved are fully identified in the reports of the Museum Committee in the Society files. Without their selfless aid, the Society would not have been able to afford moving the cabin this year, much less consider placing a monumental rock on the grounds of it. Their generosity is deeply appreciated.

The weekly column in the St. John Valley Times was continued with the help of Mr. A.J. Michaud, Mr. Guy Dubay, Mr. Austin Wylie, Mrs. Claude Cyr and Miss Bernette Albert.

DONATIONS AND FUNDS

Funds were recieved from the town of Madawaska and Aroostook County from appropriations.

Fund-raising projects were an antique auction and food and candy sales. (Projects during early 1971 were indicated in the previous Newsletter.)
